

The LAD-owned Pioneer Forest is Missouri's largest private working forest with over 140,000 acres of carefully managed oak and pine woods. In addition to conducting research on its "uneven aged" method of forest management known as single tree selection harvest, Pioneer Forest also:

Restores natural communities, preserves native species, and maintains healthy forests and woodlands.






